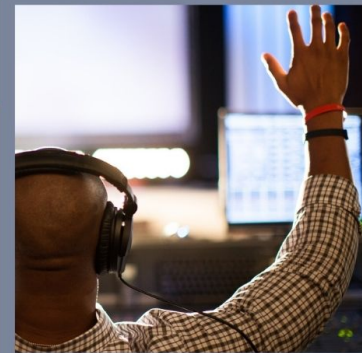
Serve in Worship

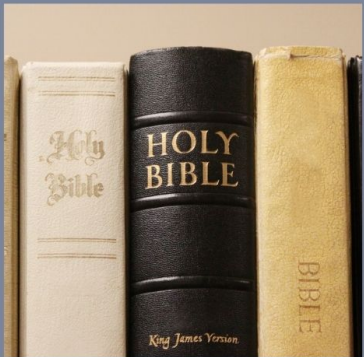

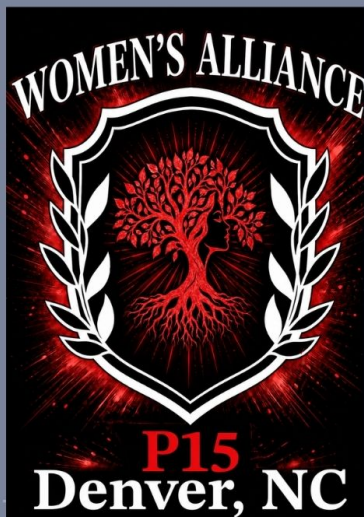


WALK TO EMMAUS

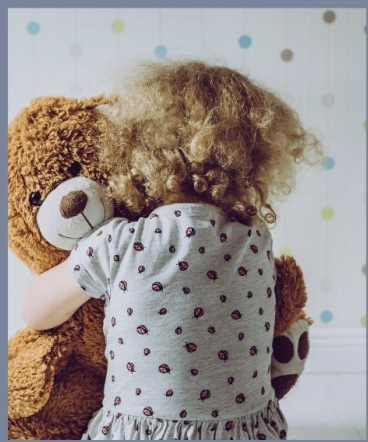

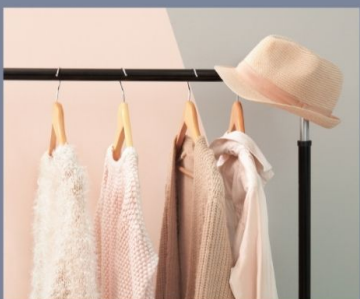
R FRIENDS - RESPITE FOR ALL

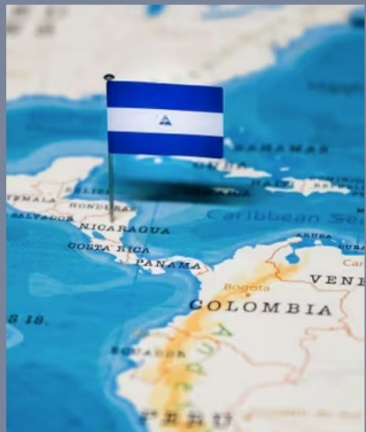

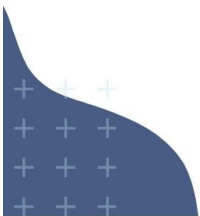
