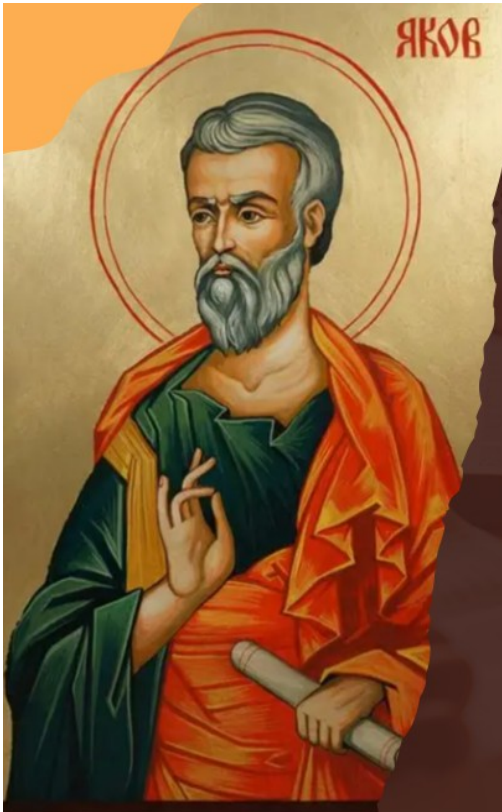

Amiera, the talented granddaughter of George Anger, has qualified to represent Team Canada at the World Down Syndrome Swimming Championships in Portugal!

While Amiera has conquered the pool, her family is now working hard to cover the expenses for the trip. George shares the inspiring details of her success, their fundraising journey so far, and how we can all help in his note below...

Amiera, my grand daughter, finished well at the Canadian Special Olympics, winning 2 gold, 1 silver and 2 bronze medals.

Her performance qualified her to compete at the World Down Syndrome swimming championships in Portugal coming at the end of October.

Problem though. No government funding. Amiera and her mom, who is one of the team coaches, has to pay their own way \$15000. They will be part of Team Canada.

So we've been fund raising. Last weekend in Turkey Point, we gathered 3500 beer cans and \$175 in bottles. They also had a bottle / can collection in Stratford.

Some dear friends helped by making a cash donation. Thanks Liz and Andi and some generous neighbors. But they still have a long way to go. Hence my note. If you can donate in any way, it would be greatly appreciated.

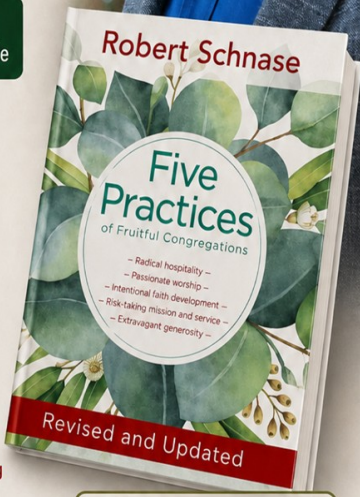

*Generosity – a fruit of the spirit –
a sign of spiritual growth*

Fellow, and finally as Master of Pembroke College. His learning was immense, and he knew so many languages (a wit once said) that he could have been “the interpreter-general at the confusion of tongues.”

His gifts as a scholar not only won him a seat on the commission which produced the King James Version of the Bible in 1611, but also successive appointments as bishop of Chichester, Ely, and finally Winchester. But there was more to Andrewes than scholarship and the prestige it won for him. While Master of Pembroke College he was also the rector of a London church where he nourished his congregation with instruction in the art and discipline of prayer; and every Saturday he used to walk the aisles of old St. Paul's Cathedral, ready to hear any who came to him for confession and spiritual counsel.

Likewise, in his sermons, he marshalled all his learning in order to expound with passion the saving truth contained in each word and phrase of his text. At his death in 1626 he left behind another testimony to his devotion, a little book called “Private Prayers,” in which texts from Scripture and the Church's ancient liturgies were brought together in a braid of adoration, praise, thanksgiving, penitence, oblation, intercession, and petition. Thus, in private prayer as in public office, Lancelot Andrewes sought to be in touch with the deepest springs of Christian action, experience and thought — so that his character became like a mirror in which the Church of England beheld the rich integrity of its own inheritance.
