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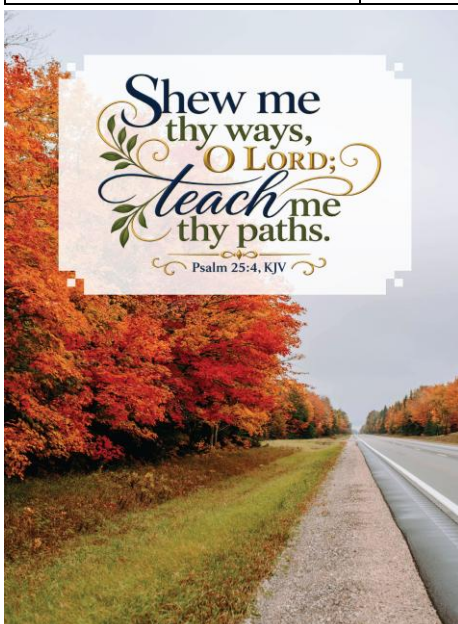
SPRC Announcement

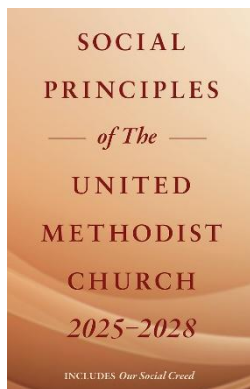
Moving On: Adult Studies at Wesley UMC

“These principles are the result of prayerful consideration and thoughtful efforts by multiple General Conferences to address complex and controversial global issues.

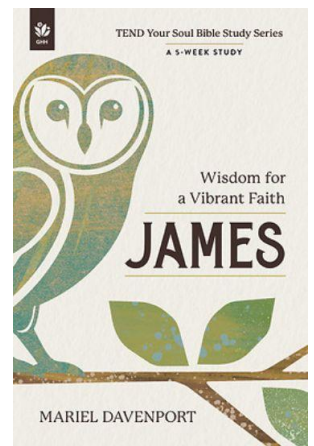


By engaging in this study, you can delve into your own theology and ethics, allowing you to grow in discipleship and further explore your beliefs.”

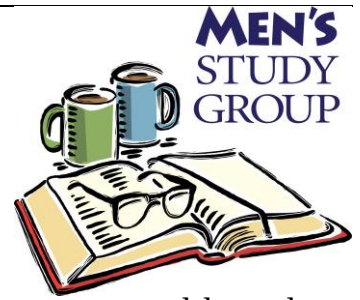

Tithing, Pledging, Estimated Giving – What is it and why is it important?

An excellent gift of God, answering the noblest ends – John Wesley

As we begin our Stewardship campaign, I hope this article will help answer some of your questions. In the weeks ahead, each household will receive letters and pledge cards, as well as hear about what our church does.

While Methodism's founder John Wesley did not talk directly about tithing, he did say a lot about stewardship. In his sermon on "The Use of Money," Wesley described money as "an excellent gift of God, answering the noblest ends." Stewardship includes many aspects such as giving of time, talent, **and** treasure. All three are important. As I am writing this article as the Finance Chair, this article focuses on the financial piece. Here are a few questions you may have.

What is a pledge? A pledge is an estimate of how much money you plan to give to Wesley Church each year. It is **not** a binding contract. You can pledge (using the amount you plan to donate).

What is tithing? Tithing is defined as giving 10 percent of your income.

Why pledge? Your pledge makes it possible for Wesley Church to create a budget for our ministries, staffing, programs, and outreach for the coming year.

What if I cannot afford to pay the amount that I pledge? Life happens, and this is okay. Just do the best you can. If you feel the amount, you pledged is too high for your current circumstances, please contact our bookkeeper, Ame Banks, to let her know that you would like to adjust the amount. This helps us budget better.

Who sees the amount I pledge? Our Bookkeeper, Ame Banks, receives this information.

Ways to Pledge: Realm Option: If you are on Realm, you can pledge easily online. If you have created a Realm logon, you can see how much you have donated this year so far, contribute, and set up electronic giving, if desired. You can also use Realm to pledge the amount you wish to donate and choose weekly, bi-weekly, monthly, twice a month, every three months, or annually. For our next pledge cycle (which is based on a calendar year), please choose 2027 to start.

Pledge Card Option: You can also pledge using a traditional pledge card once you receive one (or they are in the pews).

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How does Wesley Church spend its money?

Each year we set a budget which we try to keep within. We spend our finances in a variety of ways – mission projects, salaries, building repairs and updates, educational materials, music, utilities, technology, office supplies, Bibles, hymnals, study guides, & Communion elements to name a few. As a church we tithe a significant percentage of our income toward missions, supporting many ministries in our local community, and our world. Wesley is a very mission focused church.
