

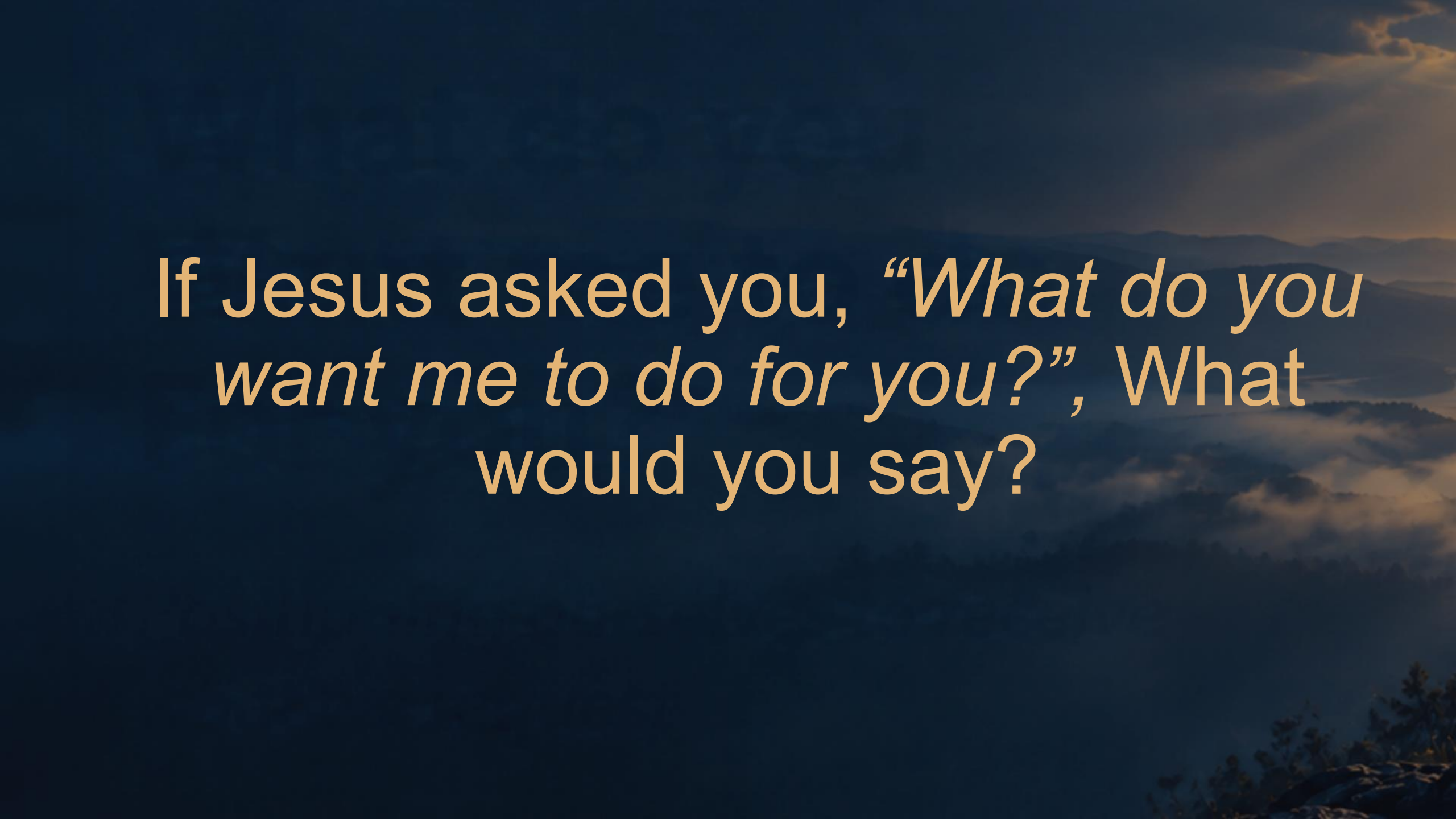

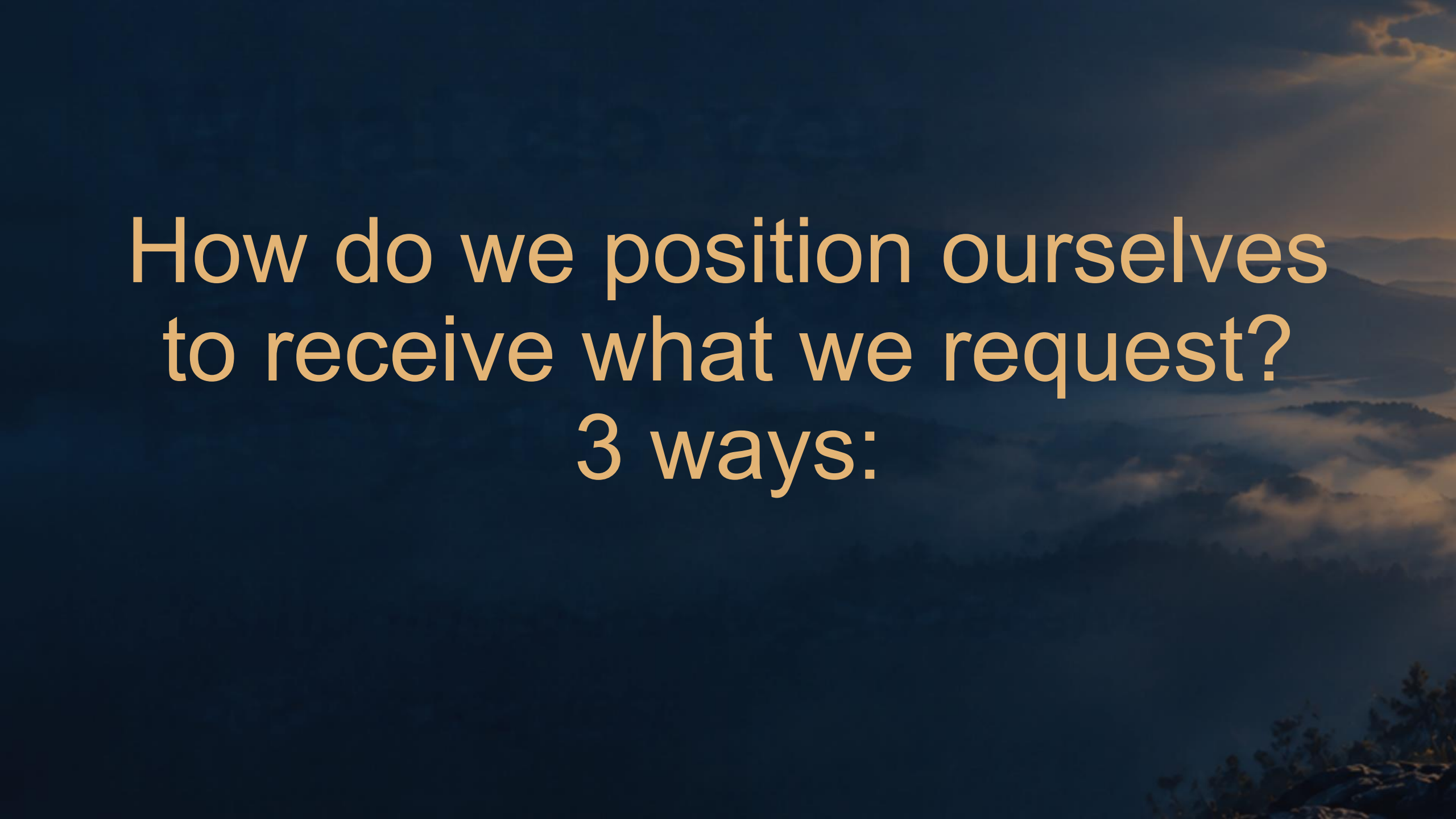

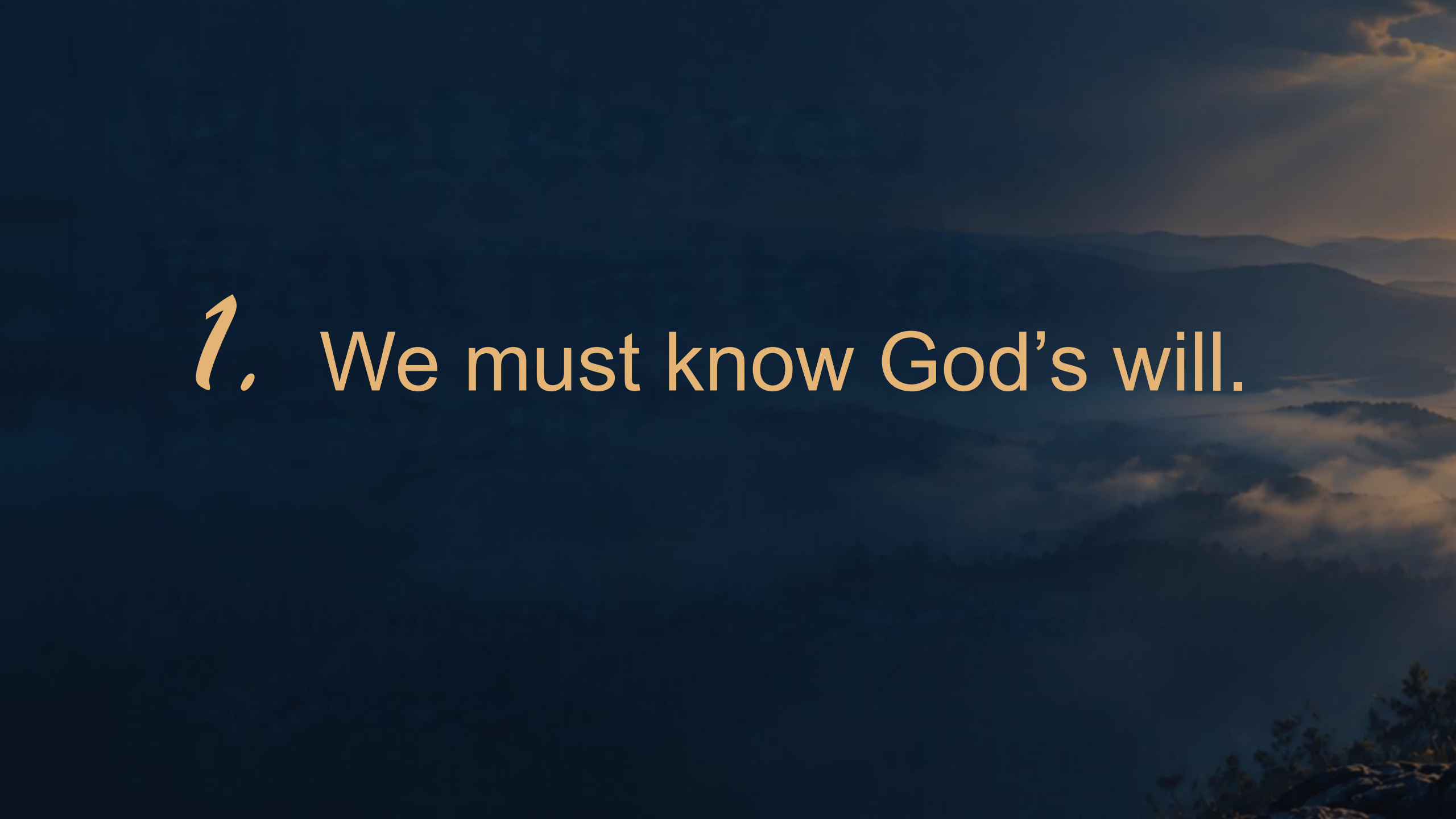
Jesus asked people all kinds of questions, but this one stands out. Every believer wants to hear this question, then give the answer that pleases God and moves Him to answer their request.

How do we position ourselves
to receive what we request?
3 ways:



1. We must know God's will.

I John 5:14-15

This is the confidence that we have in Him, that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. ¹⁵ So if we know that He hears whatever we ask, we know that we have whatever we asked of Him.

Ephesians 5:15-17

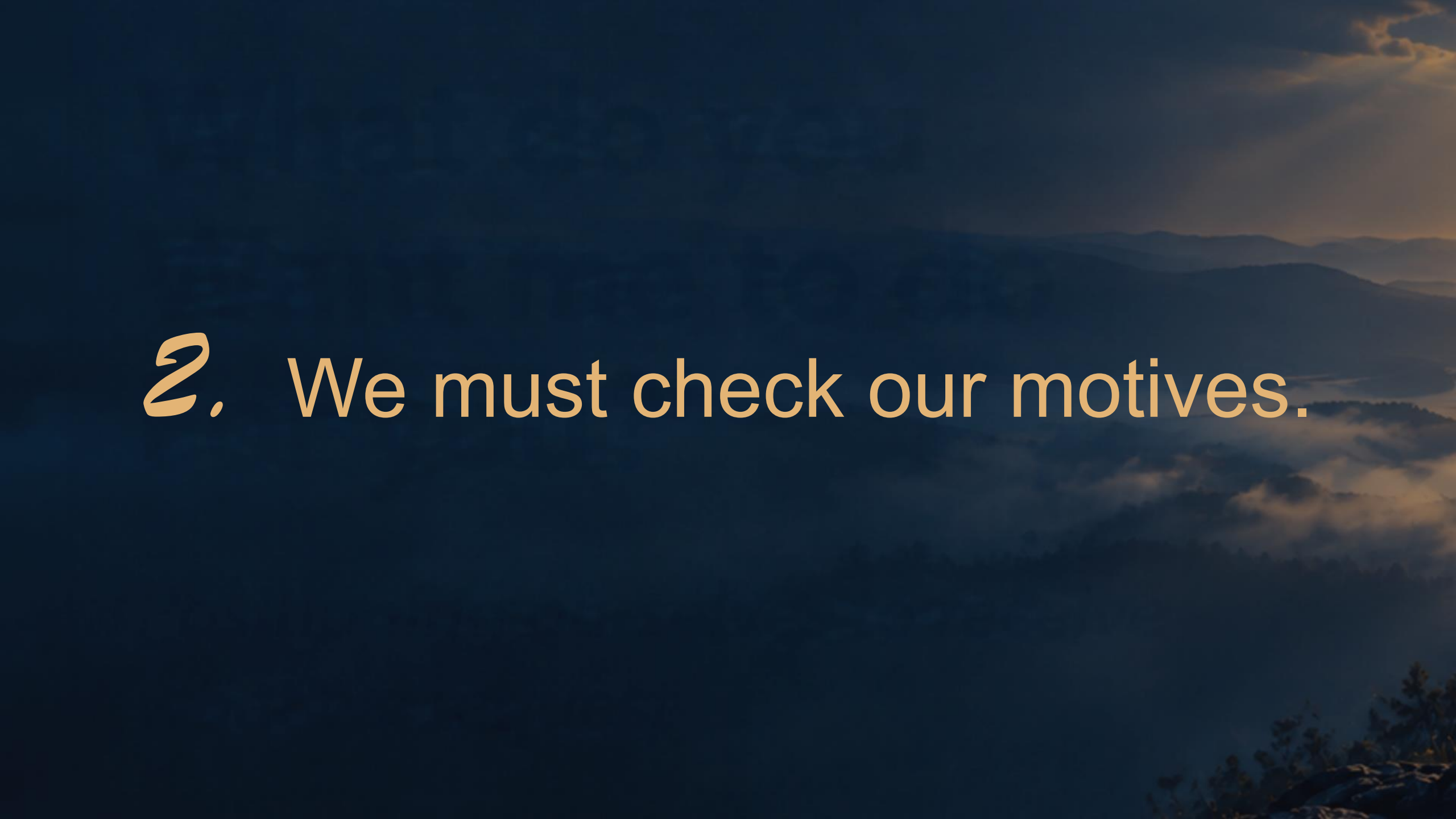
See then that you walk carefully, not as fools, but as wise men, making the most of the time because the days are evil. Therefore, do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is.

2. We must check our motives.

James 4:3

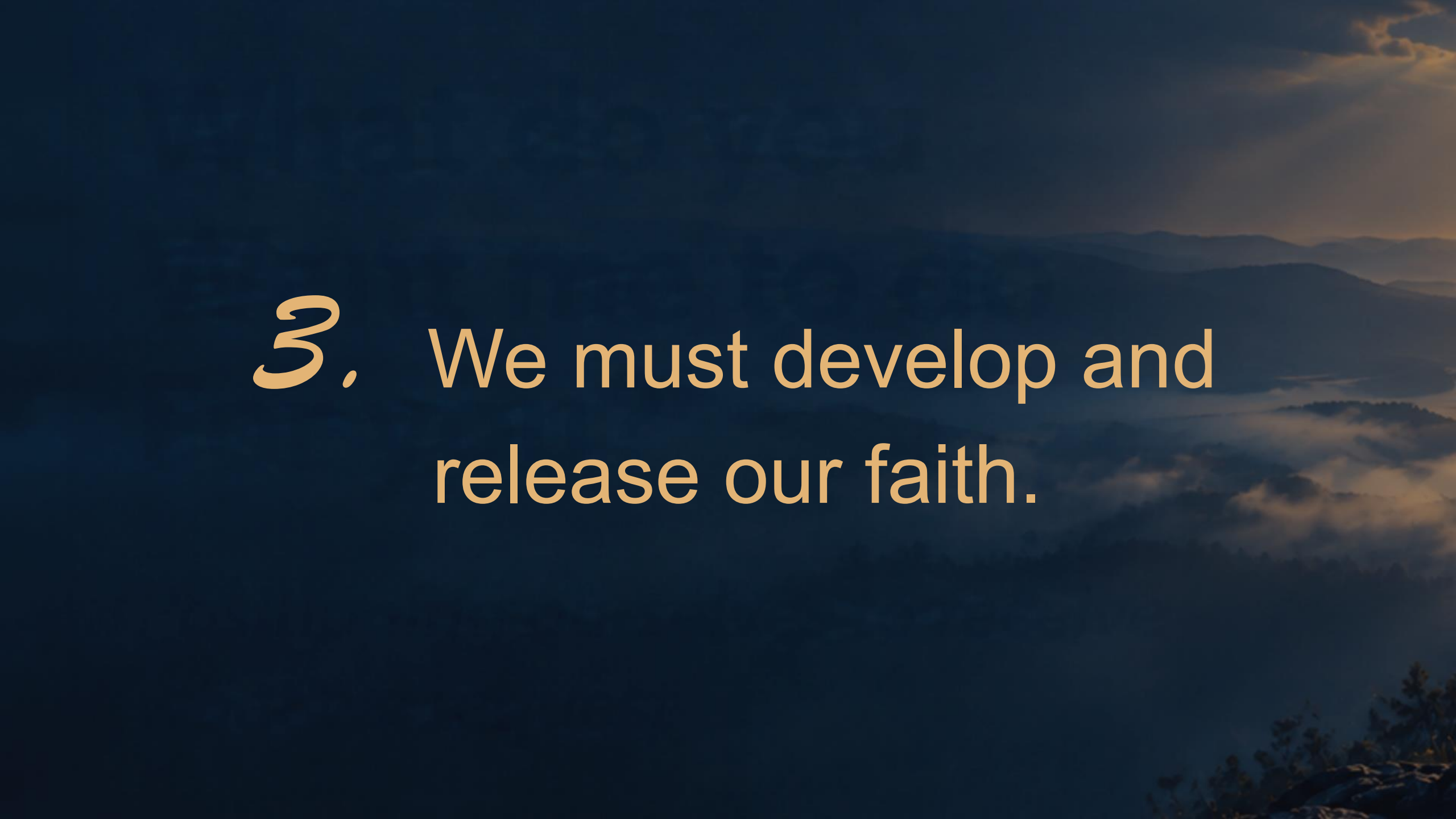
You ask, and do not receive, because you ask amiss, that you may spend it on your passions.

Hebrews 4:12

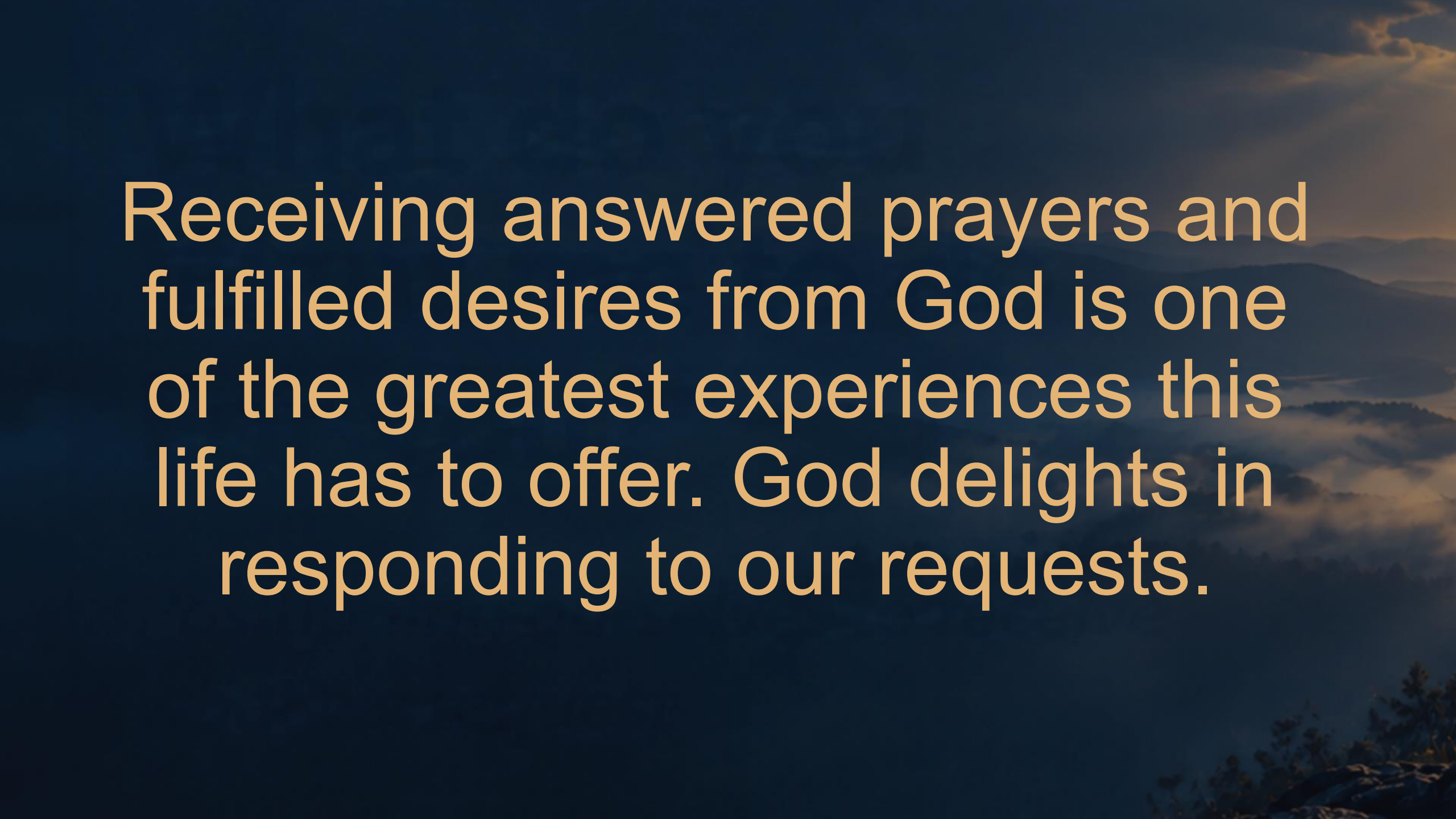

3. We must develop and
release our faith.
