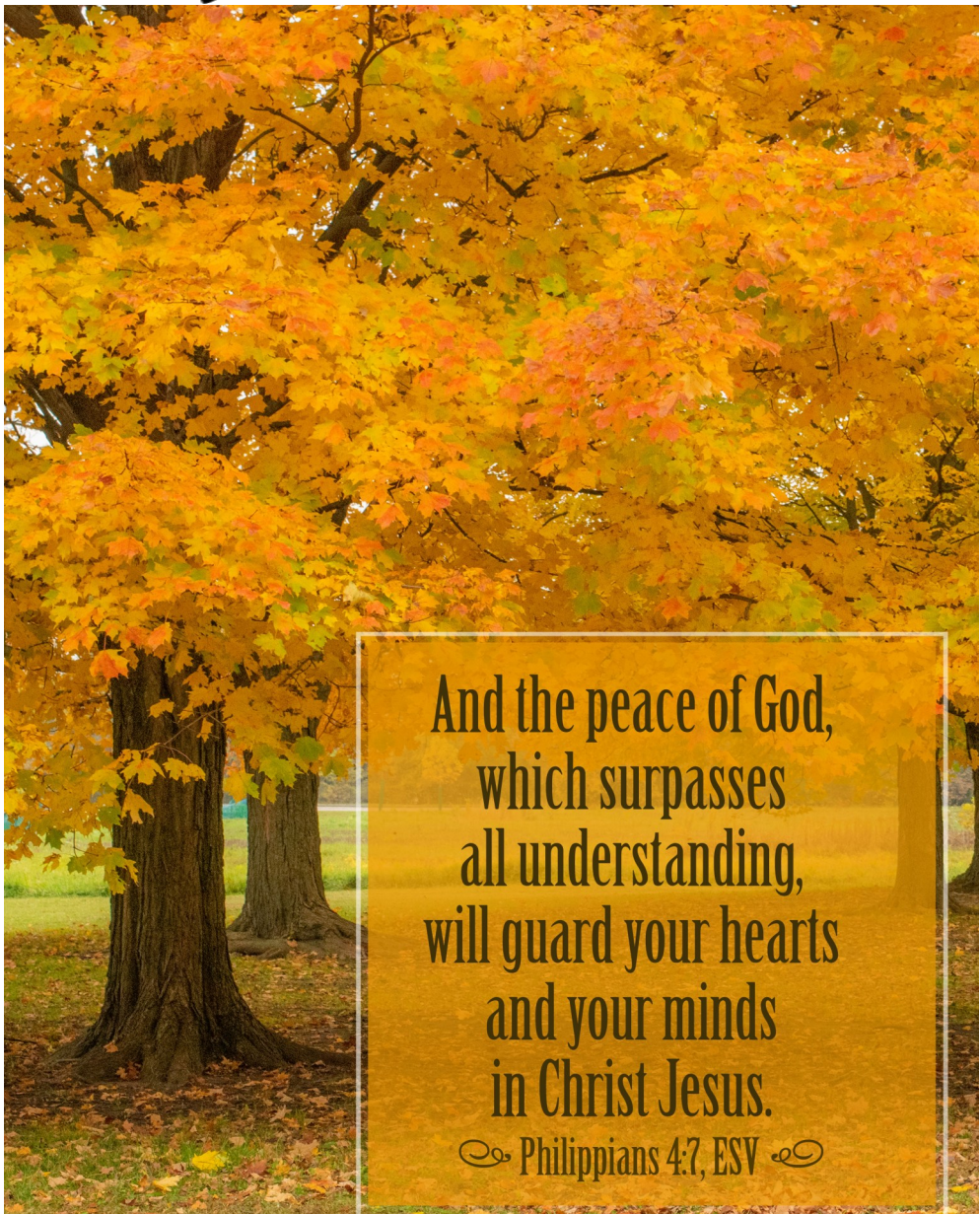

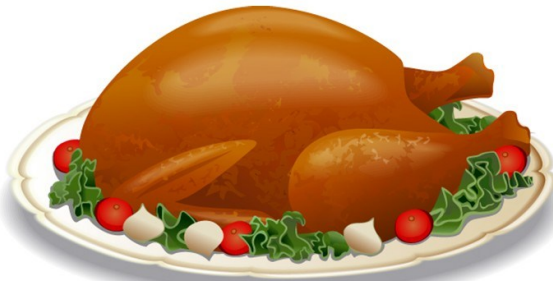

MOTLEY UNITED METHODIST CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES

September 16, 2026, 3:30 pm

Present: Robin Kramer, Sherry Frisk, Cindy Spilman, Jomyla Choate, Pastor Jonathan Holland, Chris Rosvold, Steve Sandberg

Pastor Jonathan opened the meeting with a prayer at 3:27 pm.

Minutes: A spelling correction of Kristi's name; Robin moved to accept the updated August 19 minutes; Cindy seconded, and the motion carried.

Finance Report: None at this point; just received the last of the August statements. There was an issue with the balance sheet checking account balance; Kristi is checking with CDM to resolve it. The end-of-August bank statement balance was \$15,815. Information will be forwarded to the Finance Committee when available.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Jonathan attended an area clergy prayer meeting but missed the gathering at Lakewood Hospital because he was ill. He signed up to provide a chapel service, the first of which would be on October 20, and plans to recruit volunteers, including help with music.

Confirmation class at Park UMC was scheduled to begin that evening, and Jonathan might need to leave the meeting early to attend.

Pastor Jonathan shared the Minnesota Conference Vision statement: "The United Methodist Church forms disciples of Jesus Christ, who, empowered by the Holy Spirit, love boldly, serve joyfully, and lead courageously in local communities and worldwide connections." He emphasized that the vision is intended to guide daily life, not only church activities.

There was a discussion about the need to be transparent about who is welcome to participate in various activities, specifically whether any have unstated expectations. To do otherwise risks the church being perceived as unwelcoming.

Meet-and-greet gatherings were both already happening and being planned, with the first one coming up on Friday. 16

Jonathan described meet-and-greets as an opportunity to get to know church members. He may also visit people who do not attend one of the gatherings, sometimes with little notice, depending on circumstances.

Trustees: Finance office door re-keyed; master keys still work. The door closers into the sanctuary were previously replaced, so they no longer bang shut. A lock on a back door was also repaired. Robin has spent time spot-cleaning the carpet and will continue to do so. Full carpet cleaning will probably be held off until after Christmas with the large number of activities coming up before then.

SPRC: None.

UWF: Jomyla reported that approximately 15 people planned to attend an event at Park United Methodist Church on Saturday, where Anna would speak about her life in the Amish community and her life after leaving it. The plan is to meet at the church at 8:45 am to carpool.

No one had signed up to attend the Fall gathering for Headwaters and Aurora Sky on the 26th.

The local United Women in Faith (UWF) unit became inactive two years ago; it is time to revisit whether there is enough interest to reactivate it. Jomyla is preparing a mailing list for letters and an article for the Breeze. She was considering a Christmas potluck and discussion in early December, perhaps after Sunday worship or on a Saturday, rather than automatically returning to the former second-Wednesday schedule. Jomyla also noted that the national level had changed the structure for individual units, and this would be considered.

Haiti Partnership: Jomyla said the church had received a good offering, as previously reported. Four days of mobile medical clinics began that Monday: two in Sobier and two in Yvon. Jomyla said they appeared to be going well and hoped to provide an update on Sunday. The next noisy offering will be in November, a month with five Sundays.

Memorial Committee: The new parament cabinet was

installed in the sacristy and filled; Cindy is arranging a plaque recognizing the three memorials that funded it. Some additional changes are still needed for the banner-holding rods. Appreciation was expressed for the banners currently displayed in the church, and there was discussion about obtaining a smaller banner for Communion Sundays.

Old Business: Usher/Greeters: The council discussed the need for a volunteer call list of ushers for funerals and other special events, including funerals without a funeral home. The group agreed that ushers need not be men and that a notice should be placed in the Breeze asking members whether they would join a call list.

There was discussion about the services with Staples, conversations with people from Staples UMC, and what the process for deciding things going forward would look like based on the guidance received so far.

Bible distribution is scheduled for October 4. Four children are expected, and Cindy confirmed the date should work for their families.

The first Saturday breakfast of the season is scheduled for September 26. After discussion, the group felt preparations were generally under control.

Sherry reported that the turkey dinner was under control: needed items had been ordered or purchased. Squash might not be available, but other preparations were in place. Game Day will not take place on October 14; we need to make sure that is communicated.

The lefse-making date was not confirmed during the meeting. We will settle on a date soon.

Sherry said the bazaar plans are progressing: 13 craft tables have been confirmed so far, and other confirmations are still pending. We would like to collect current vendor contact details and information about the items they plan to bring so future bazaar planning and promotion are better organized.

Santa Day preparations had begun. People are already talking about it, and some items have started arriving. A big box 18

is currently in the conference room for them.

New Business:

The council agreed to move its Wednesday meetings to 10:00 AM, beginning in October and continuing through May. The adjustment removes some Wednesday evening timing issues.

Date for Fall Charge Conference: The council selected Sauk Centre on October 24 at 1:00 pm. The church Charge Conference will require advance preparation and announcements through several channels, ideally two or three times before the event. We should have 3-5 people registered in advance.

We need to have things ready for council approval at our next meeting, particularly the pastoral compensation forms, which should come through SPRC. The church can submit its current leadership list and ask Charge Conference to authorize the church council to fill remaining positions later. Jonathan would prefer not to make too many leadership changes immediately because of lack of familiarity, but we do need a replacement for the SPRC chair. We have no recommendations for member removals to be approved; that process has not been pursued and is lengthy.

The group discussed names to include in the All Saints remembrance on November 1. Sherry and others favored including people with meaningful connections to the church rather than risk overlooking them.

The next council meeting is on October 21 at 10 am. The meeting adjourned at 4:40 pm .
